RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING MATERIALS ACCEPTED

The following is a list of recyclable materials accepted by Resource Management:

Commingled Containers:

Aluminum Cans, Trays & Foil: Trays & foil—must be cleaned.

Aseptic Packaging & Gable Top Containers: Milk & juice cartons.

Steel Cans & Tins: Including aerosol cans.

Glass Bottles & Jars: Clear, brown & green. No window glass, dinnerware or ceramics.

Plastic Containers:

Plastics have an identifying code on the bottom of each container. Listed are examples of plastic containers that are in that category. Many other product containers can be recycled by utilizing the plastic identifying code.

| #1 PET (#1 clear & green plastic resin) | Such as: Soda, water, & flavored beverage bottles. |
| #2 HDPE (#2 clear plastic resin) | Such as: Milk & juice jugs. |
| #2 HDPE (#2 colored plastic resin) | Such as: Detergent & fabric softener containers. |
| #3 PVC Narrow neck containers only (#3 plastic resin) | Such as: Health & beauty aid products & household cleaners. |
| #4 LDPE Grocery containers (#4 plastic resin) | Such as: Margarine tubs, frozen desert cups, 6 & 12 pack rings. |
| #5 PP Grocery Containers (#5 plastic resin) | Such as: Yogurt cups & narrow neck syrup & ketchup bottles. |
| #7 OTHER Plastic Resin Narrow Neck Containers Only | |
| Plastic Buckets | <i>Such as:</i> Kitty litter containers (5 gallon size maximum). |

⊘ #6 Polystyrene is not recyclable at this time. Please refrain from placing #6 plastic in your bin.

Residential Paper Fiber:

Newspaper, including inserts (Remove plastic sleeves)

Cardboard (No waxed cardboard)

Kraft Bags (Brown paper bags)

Magazines, Catalogs & Telephone Books

Office, Computer Paper, Notebook & Gift Wrap Paper (No metal clips, spirals or binders)

Chipboard (Cereal, cake & food mix boxes, gift boxes, etc.)

Carrier Stock (Soda & beer can carrying cases)

Mail, Junk Mail & Envelopes (No plastic cards, stick on labels or unused stamps)

Paper Back Books (No hard cover books)
